 - Click "Save"
3. **Register our organization (or renew in April)**
 - Sign in to your Kroger account using your email and password from step 2
 - Click blue menu item "Community" at the top right
 - Click the dropdown "Community Rewards"
 - Click the orange "Enroll Now" button
 - Under "Find Your Organization" type "80543" and click Search
 - Click the little circle next to Legacy Fdn and click "Enroll"
4. **Use the card** when you shop at Kroger!
